
General note: Any notes or phrases can happen in any octave that is comfortable or euphoric. Any number of singers of any voice part can sing this, ideally at least two. Stylistically, each singer should sing in a way that feels like *them*. Dynamics are also left up to the singer to decide, with the caveat that the singers should stay aware of each other and never purposefully drown someone else out


